INTRODUCTION

In August 2019, The Georgian Young Lawyers' Association (GYLA), with the support of USAID, launched the project "Free, Fair and Equal Electoral-Political 2019-2022 Cycle in Georgia". It covers the territory of Tbilisi, Kakheti, Mtskheta-Mtianeti, Kvemo Kartli, Shida Kartli, Imereti, Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti, Guria and Adjara.

One of the primary goals of the project is to support improvement of the electoral environment through monitoring and evidence-based advocacy. To this end, GYLA will monitor ongoing political processes and develop recommendations that will be presented to the public and decision-makers.

STATE OF EMERGENCY AND CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Due to the spread of the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19), from March 21 to April 21, a state of emergency was declared in the country.¹ On April 22, the Parliament of Georgia approved the Presidential decree² by 97 votes against 10,³ extending the emergency state for another month.

Hence, the discussions over the draft constitutional law have been suspended.⁴ Provided that the state of emergency is terminated within the planned period, it will be possible to amend the supreme law in the time remaining until the elections.⁵ GYLA hopes that documenting the agreement at the legislative level will not be jeopardized.

SENTENCING OF IRAKLI OKRUASHVILI

On April 13, 2020, Irakli Okruashvili, the former Minister of Defense, was found guilty by the court and sentenced to five years imprisonment.⁶ The judge acquitted Okruashvili of the leadership of group violence but found him guilty of participating in a gang violence.⁷ The convict refuses to plead guilty and intends to appeal the decision to the Court of Appeals.⁸ The former minister was arrested on July 25, 2019 in connection with the events of June 20-21 of the same year.⁹

According to the opposition, the memorandum signed on March 8, 2020¹⁰ envisages the revision of high profile cases and release of members of the opposition party through various mechanisms.¹¹ On April 13, 2020, the opposition published an open letter urging partners and supporters to remind the Georgian government of the impor-

tance of fully implementing the March 8 agreement.¹²

On April 14, the U.S. Embassy issued a statement expressing its concerns over the political interference and selective use of justice, and called on the signatory parties to adhere to the requirements of the March 8 agreement.¹³ Carl Hartzell, EU Ambassador to Georgia, also responded to the fact, noting that the decision casts doubts over the principle of impartiality, contains the risks of polarization and called on the parties to remain committed to the 8 March agreement.¹⁴

ELECTORAL LEGISLATION REFORM

Currently, the Parliament is discussing the amendments to the Election Code online in order to reflect the OSCE recommendations in the legislation.¹⁵ Political parties, international organizations and the civil society organizations participate in the sessions.

The Parliament began elaborating the amendments to the election legislation as part of the autumn 2019 sessions.¹⁶ GYLA has been actively involved in the process from the very beginning. Four sessions were held in March and April,¹⁷ where the organization expressed its opinions regarding the amendments discussed.

GYLA welcomes the steps taken to eliminate the existing shortcomings and is pleased to see that some of the remarks have been reflected in the bill, yet there are still gaps in the election legislation that shall not be overlooked. Among them are the issues as follows:

- A model of composing the election administration does not ensure equal representation in election commissions and serves to strengthen the positions of the ruling party in them. It is necessary to reduce the number of members of election commissions and employ staff based on their professional background;
- In case of repeated expulsion of an observer/electoral subject from a polling station, the person shall be deprived of the right to exercise the authority of the observer or the representative of the election subject on the same day. This amendment is problematic as there is no mechanism for timely and effective appeal of such decisions;
- The proposed draft fails to protect the electorate from undue influence and to ensure free expression of the will of the voters on the election day, for which it is necessary to determine a certain perimeter at precinct election commissions, within which no one will be allowed to be present unless they are specially authorized to do so, also the Election Silence Day shall be extend to the day prior to the elections;
- The scope of existing financial incentives cannot ensure that women participation in politics will increase.¹⁸ It is necessary to introduce a temporary mandatory mechanism - quotas.

GYLA calls on the ruling party to take into consideration the above recommendations that will significantly improve the electoral environment and contribute to a peaceful and fair election.
